- 17 counties participated
- 95 stakeholders trained
- 78 obtained ACRE certification
- 58 individuals became employed






Benefits Planning and Asset Development





Florida Employment First Act of 2016

- State-wide commitment to prioritize employment
- Consistent definition of competitive integrated employment
- Required Interagency Cooperative Agreement





Florida Employment First Act of 2016

- Identified common objectives:
 - Maximize resources
 - Identify strategic goals/benchmarks
 - Prioritize financing of employment
 - Create training opportunities
 - Collaborate in service plan development
 - Promote service innovation
 - Develop accountability measures





Employment Options Informed Choice

- Curriculum
- Train-the-Trainer
- 32 staff from 10 organizations trained
- 36 job seekers participated
- Five employed



Employment First Collaborative Training Initiative

- · Six regional sites identified and efforts initiated
- Extensive training and mentoring based on self-assessment of competencies and implementation training plans
- Collaboration with regional Employment First Partner designees to create a culture that supports efficient and quality employment outcomes and translates best practice employment training content into practice
- Culminates in up to 50 participants earning ACRE certificate
